CHAPTER NO.

A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT to add new Sections 300 to 304, inclusive, to Article 77 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1957 Edition), title "Public Education", to follow immediately after Section 299 thereof and to be under the new sub-title "Community Colleges", authorizing the Board of School Commissioners of Baltimore City and the Board of Education of any county to establish and maintain community colleges, generally defining the powers and duties of such boards as trustees for community colleges, providing for the financing of these schools generally on a formula of one-third from the state, one-third from the political sub-division, and one-third from students' fees, providing for details of the operations of such community colleges and relating generally to the establishment and operation of certain community colleges in this State.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,
That new Sections 300 to 304, inclusive, be and they are hereby added
to Article 77 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1957 Edition),
title "Public Education", to follow immediately after Section 299
thereof and to be under the new sub-title "Community Colleges", and
all to read as follows:

Community Colleges

2 300. (a) The Board of Education of any county and the Board of School Commissioners of Baltimore City, with the approval of the 4 State Superintendent of Schools, by appropriate resolution, may es-5 tablish and maintain community colleges. For the purposes of ad-6 ministration over these colleges the board of education shall con-7 stitute a board of trustees and governmental corporation vested with 8 the following Powers:

9 (b) To maintain and exercise general control over the community 10 college, to keep separate records and minutes, and to adopt reason-11 able rules, by-laws or regulations to effectuate and carry out the pro-12 visions of this sub-title.

13 (c) To appoint, on the recommendation of the superintendent of schools, a president of the community college, qualified teaching personnel, and such other employees as may be necessary for its efficient administration; to fix the salaries and tenure of the president, teachers, and other employees and to discharge them for good cause, provided those with tenure shall have reasonable notice of the grounds for their dismissal and an opportunity to be heard.

EXPLANATION: Italics indicate new matter added to existing law.

- 20 (d) To purchase, lease, condemn, or in any other manner acquire 21 real and personal property deemed necessary by the board of trustees 22 for the operation of the community college.
- 23 (e) To sell, lease, or in any other manner dispose of community 24 college assets, real or personal, at public or private sale; provided 25 that the president of the community college and the chairman of the 26 board of trustees are authorized to execute legal conveyances and 27 other documents pursuant to an appropriate resolution of the board 28 of trustees.
- 29 (f) To utilize, if permission is duly granted, any land, buildings, 30 personal assets, or other facilities of the board of education of the 31 county or Baltimore City.
- 32 (g) To receive local, state, and federal funds to defray the cost of 33 the college program authorized by this sub-title and to accept both 34 conditional and unconditional gifts, as the case may be, from private 35 persons.
- 36 (h) To determine entrance requirements and the courses of study, 37 subject to minimum standards fixed by the State Department of Edu-38 cation. If such minimum standards are not met, no certificate of ap-39 proval shall be issued by the State Department of Education.
- 40 (i) To charge reasonable fees to students with a view to making 41 college education available at low cost to all qualified persons.
- 42 (j) To create by resolution an advisory board for the community 43 college, with staggered terms of office, and to appoint the member-44 ship of this board. The board of trustees shall meet with the advi-45 sory board, if such is created, at least once annually to review the 46 problems of the community college.
- (k) To enter into agreements or contracts with any person, firm, or corporation, or with any county, state, federal or governmental agencies which are deemed by the board of trustees to be necessary or advisable to the establishment, maintenance, and operation of the community college. This power includes agreements between or among the counties and Baltimore City, their county commissioners or councils and boards of trustees designed to create and support a community college for two or more counties, or Baltimore City.
- 301. For the purposes of this sub-title a Community College is defined as an institution of higher education, offering at least one two-year program of post high school education and performing one or more of the following functions:
- 5 (1) Offering terminal vocational, technical and semi-professional programs;
- 7 (2) Offering terminal non-technical programs; or
- 8 (3) Offering the equivalent of freshman and sophomore years of college work.
- 302. (a) The county superintendent of schools (and in Baltimore City the Superintendent of Public Instruction) shall serve as secretary and treasurer to the board of trustees. The president of the community college shall attend all meetings of the board, except those involving his personal position as president. The board of trustees, the superintendent, and the president of the community college are charged with the preparation of the annual budget, its presentation to the county commissioners, county council, or the Board of Estimates of Baltimore City, and the receipt and expenditure of budgeted

10 funds under an adequate accounting system, subject to review by
11 the auditor of the county or of Baltimore City, as the case may be.
12 The Board of Trustees shall be styled "The Board of Trustees of
13 Community College" and it may adopt
14 a corporate seal. The Chairman of the board of education or the
15 board of school commissioners is the chairman of the board of
16 trustees.

17 (b) All professional and clerical employees are eligible for partici-18 pation in the Teachers Retirement System as established and main-19 tained under this Article.

303. The Mayor and City Council of Baltimore and the county commissioners or county council of any county in which a community 3 college is established by the board of education or board of school commissioners under this sub-title have the right and power to appropriate funds to meet the cost of establishment, current expenses, purchase of land, construction of capital improvements, and the maintenance thereof. In addition, the county commissioners or county council of any county and the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore City have the power to borrow funds for the purchase of land and the construction of capital improvements for said purposes upon such 10 11 terms and conditions as they deem right and proper, subject to the 12 general requirements of local laws applicable to the creation of pub-13 lic debt.

304. (a) Each community college operating under the provisions of this sub-title shall be financed on the general basis of receiving one-third of its current expenses from the State, one-third from the county (or Baltimore City) in which it is located, and one-third from fees and charges required from students at the community college. In this computation, "current expenses" shall be the product of the per-student operating cost for the preceding school year multiplied by the number of full-time equivalent students enrolled in the Current school year.

(b) Beginning for the State's fiscal year which commences on July 1, 1963, the Governor shall place in the State budget an item to 10 pay the State's one-third share to each of the community colleges 11 operating under this sub-title. Until that time, State aid to these colleges shall be as provided in the budget. In either event it shall not 12 13 exceed the sum of two hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$225.00) 14 for each student at any community college. The State Superintendent of Schools shall certify to the State Comptroller on or before the last 15 16 day of both September and March in each year one-half of the annual 17 18 amount which is due the local board of trustees of each community college and thereupon the Comptroller within five days shall draw 19 20 his warrant on the Treasurer of the State of Maryland for the respec-21 tive amounts due the said local boards of trustees; and the Treasurer of the State of Maryland upon receiving such warrants shall immediately pay the amounts due to the respective local boards of 23 24 trustees.

(c) In any such political sub-division in which a community college is operating under the provisions of this sub-title, the board of county commissioners, county council, or Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall provide and pay to the community college or colleges therein the political sub-division's one-third share of current expenses. The State Superintendent of Schools shall certify to the Treasurer of each county or of Baltimore City as the case may be on or before the last day of both September and March in each year one-half of the annual amount which is due the local board of trustees of each community college and thereupon the Treasurer within five

35 days of each of these dates shall draw his warrant on the county or 36 the City of Baltimore as the case may be and shall pay the amount 37 due to the board of trustees of the community college or colleges in 38 his respective political sub-division.
(d) Students from outside the State of Maryland who attend a community college shall pay a full fee which covers the one-third share of the State and also the one-third share of the political subdivision in addition to the regular fees and charges for students. Out-do-county (or City) students from Maryland who attend a community college shall pay two-thirds of a full fee, which includes the one-third share of the political sub-division in addition to the regular fees and charges for students. Any political sub-division which does not operate a community college under the provisions of this sub-title may levy and appropriate funds to pay the one-third share of the political sub-divisions for its residents who attend a community college in another political sub-division.
