

# UMBC BASKETBALL TEAM GOES DIVISION I

Division I basketball will hit the UMBC campus by storm this winter. New Head Men's Basketball Coach Jeff Bzdelik has brought in a group of newcomers that will have an immediate impact on UMBC basketball. The Retrievers face a rigorous schedule that features Maryland-College Park, Navy, and Northwestern. UMBC also has ten home games including 1985-86 NIT entrant Northern Arizona (December 2nd), and local rivals Towson State (Alumni Night, December 20), Coppin State and the mighty Mount St. Mary's.

Sue Furnary's women's team will try to duplicate their outstanding season of a year ago, when they won 20 games. The team will be lead by District III All-American Tammy McCarthy.

The women also play a tough Division I slate that features
Maryland-College Park,
Florida, and
Northwestern. Feature
home games for women are against Liberty
(December 2nd), Delaware and Mount St. Mary's.

#### NEW SWIM TEAM
